

The Abdeali Kamrudin Award

Abdeali Kamrudin had a strong passion and dedication to the optical industry, accumulating his knowledge of opticianry work from the ground up. Arriving to Canada as a refugee in 1972, Abdeali opened his own lens manufacturing lab and progressed to his first optical retail shop in 1984. Abdeali leaves behind a legacy with his three daughters who are Opticians and continue to run the family business (and its sister location) as well as three grandchildren involved in the optical industry.

Abdeali's family wishes to continue his legacy by supporting the future of Opticianry in the form of a student award for one (1) student in British Columbia who is embarking on their path to become a Licensed Optician.

Value of Award: \$1,500

Number of Awards: 1

Disbursement Year: 2024

Criteria/Eligibility: Available to registered students residing in British Columbia who are enrolled in, or enrolling in, the first term or semester of an Opticianry Program offered through Douglas College, NAIT or Stenberg College. Students must be enrolled in, or enrolling in, a full course load. Awarded based on community involvement and financial need.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

- Applicant must be a Canadian Citizen or Permanent Resident, and reside within the province of British Columbia
- Applicant must be registered for a full course load in Semester One/Term One of an Opticianry Program through Douglas College, Northern Alberta Institute of Technology (NAIT) or Stenberg College.
 - Douglas College – Dispensing Opticianry Program (Students enrolled/enrolling in Fall 2024 term)
 - Northern Alberta Institute of Technology – Optical Sciences Eyeglasses Program (NAIT/OAC Students enrolled in Fall 2024 intake or enrolling in Winter 2025 Intake of Eyeglass Year One, Semester One)
 - Stenberg College – Optician Diploma Program (Students enrolled/enrolling in Spring and Fall 2024 intake, Semester One)
- Applicant must demonstrate community involvement and financial need.

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS/PROCESS

- Award applicants must create* a profile on the Opticians Association of Canada (OAC) portal, unless you already have one, to be able to access the application form and apply for this award. Creating a profile and membership with the OAC is FREE for students, therefore, there is no cost to create your profile. When setting up your profile, please pay attention to the communication section to determine if you wish to receive

communications from the OAC. If you choose not to receive communications from the OAC, you will still receive communications from us related to your application for this award.

** NAIT Students – if you are currently enrolled or have applied for enrollment, you already created your profile.*

- Applicant must demonstrate community involvement by explaining, in 300 words or less, the importance of community involvement and your role in your community.
- Applicant must demonstrate financial need by explaining, in 150 words or less, how this award will impact you financially.
- Applicant must upload to the online application, a letter of recommendation/reference in **PDF format (.pdf)**, outlining why you would be deserving of this award based on the criteria of community involvement. *Letter of recommendation/reference should not be written by a family member. Letter of recommendation/reference MUST be uploaded in .pdf format*
- Award applicants are required to complete all sections of the online application form and include all necessary documents as outlined. Incomplete applications will not be considered.
- **Only one (1) 'Abdeali Kamrudin Award' application allowed per student applicant.** Completing more than one (1) application may disqualify you from being considered for the award.
- **Award applications will be accepted to December 1, 2024.**
The application period closes at 11:59 PM CT on December 1, 2024.

SELECTION PROCESS

All award applications will be reviewed by a panel of individuals (the 'selection committee') made up of representative(s) from Douglas College, NAIT/OAC, and Stenberg College. Selection process will be complete by December 12, 2024.

Award recipient will be contacted and announced by **December 16, 2024**.
